PARENT OPINION SURVEY

We will again give a chocolate frog to every student whose parent completes the survey and we will raflle a prize.

TAG ON

Every student in the school has been provided with a 'tag on' tag.

What is Tag On?

- Tag On is a kiosk (small machine) with a touch screen and tags.
- Students are provided with their own tag, which they use each day to 'tag on' at the kiosk.
- As students arrive at school, they 'tag on' at the kiosk and use the touch screen to select how they travelled to school: walk, ride, car or public transport.
- Each time your child tags on they earn Individual and House points.
- The Tag On program helps schools collect information on how students are travelling to school.
- As an incentive, the house with the most points at the end of the term will take part in a fun reward!
- Students can only 'tag on' between 8:30am 8:55am when the bell goes. This promotes arriving on time to school.

Remember Part Way is OK – to create a safer environment for children outside the school gates, try to park in the streets around the school and walk, ride or scoot the rest of the way.


We are introducing this system as part of our involvement in the Department of Transport and Planning's Safe Routes to School Program, delivered by the City of Greater Bendigo.

We can't wait for our students to participate. Through initiatives such as this, we are hoping to create a safer environment for students outside the school gates. Having less cars around the school keeps students safer.




